UNDOCUMENTED YOUTH AND ADULT LEARNERS

Undocumented immigrants are those who do not fit into any of the United States' legal immigration categories: legal permanent residents, legal temporary residents, naturalized citizens, refugees or asylees. This group may have many questions and unique obstacles to applying for and paying for college. There are resources and options available to help them through the process. Certain people who came to the United States as children and meet several guidelines may request consideration of deferred action for a period of three years. This deferral will protect prevent them from being placed in any removal proceedings or being removed from the U.S. for a specified period of time.
